TIDINGS

What is Pentecost?

Pentecost is a confusing word in our liturgical calendar, because it refers to two things: (1) the entire fifty days immediately following Easter (an Old Testament meaning), and (2) the fiftieth day itself (a New Testament meaning; the word in Greek means "fiftieth day").

In the Jewish tradition, the fiftieth day after Passover was called *Shavuot*, or the Feast of Weeks. *Shavuot* marked the conclusion of a seven week long grain harvest, and was the day when the first fruits of the harvest were presented to God (see Lev 23:9-22); in later Jewish tradition *Shavuot* became the day when the giving of the law by Moses was commemorated. The Acts of the Apostles record that on the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles who were gathered together in Jerusalem, and rested upon them as tongues of fire, and allowed them to speak in many languages. The name

"Pentecost" was applied by the Church to the feast celebrating this event, and it became popularly known as Whitsunday. During the first four centuries after Christ's death, "Pentecost" was used to designate the 50 day period between Easter and Whitsunday (the Paschal time). This use of the word became fixed in the Nicene canons. During Paschal time (the fifty days of Easter), many churches omit the confession and allow prayer only while standing in accordance with the first Council of Nicaea.

During those first four centuries, Whitsunday (May 11, this year) signaled both Christ's ascent and the Spirit's descent. When a separate Ascension festival was created and celebrated on the fortieth day after Easter (May 1, this year), the bestowal of the Holy Spirit became the principle focus of Whitsunday. Whitsunday ranks, after Easter, as the sec-

ond greatest festival in the Church. “Whitsunday” is thought to derive from the white robes worn by the newly baptized on that day. It is one of the seven principal feasts of the Church (BCP, page 15), is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, and is a recommended day for Baptisms (BCP, page 298).

On Sunday, May 11, we will commemorate Pentecost by reading the Gospel first in several languages simultaneously followed by a second reading in English. If you speak a foreign language and would like to assist us with this reading, please contact the church office right away. Also, please remember to wear bright

colors at church that Sunday. Break out the reds, yellows, oranges, blues, and white to signify the fire of Pentecost.

Pentecost is the day we celebrate the birth of the Church, born through the outpouring of the Spirit. Like the greening of the earth around us, it is a time for us to join together in prayer and song and celebrate the goodness of God and God’s grace made available to us through the Spirit. Alleluia!

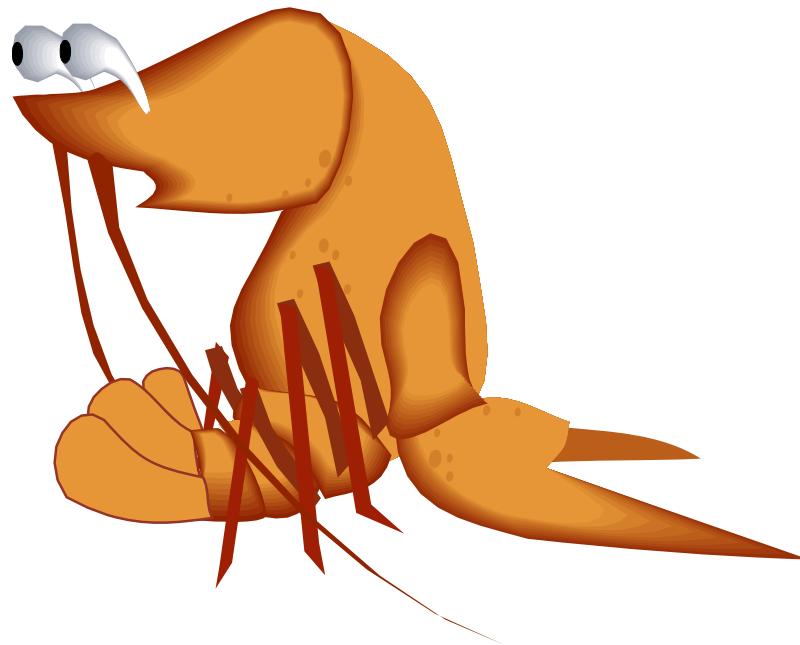

Replacement RIZO RZ 390 Digital Duplicator	\$8700	The “Rizo” copier is the type of copying machine that we use to prepare bulletins at less per copy cost than standard photocopies. Our Rizo is old and cannot duplicate the large paper we really want to use, and it is beginning to show signs of failure.
Resealing the Parish Hall and adjacent floors	\$1600	The parish hall floors can be made to look like the narthex floor by periodic professional cleaning and resealing.
4 th and 5 th grade classroom implements and reconfiguring.	\$2000	In order to implement the Godly Play program, we need to acquire some manipulative teaching materials (for tactile learning), as well as some bookcases, shelving, tables, etc. We also will need to repaint and redecorate the room.

THE PURPOSE OF YOUTH SUNDAY...

Youth Sunday at Trinity will be at the 10:30am service on May 4th. Please join us to show our young people your support and see the results of all the hard work they have put into this service.

Why do we designate a Sunday as Youth Sunday? Why are the youth given the responsibility of sharing in the leadership of the worship service?

First of all, a youth service allows the young people to use their gifts and abilities in the leading of a worship experience that involves the community of believers. It says to young and old alike that young people have gifts and abilities which can be used to worship God. God can speak to his people through the lives of our children and

young people. That in itself is an important statement.

Secondly, it is one way in which the young people of the church can serve the larger fellowship. It is a way of giving. This is something that young people need to (and sometimes even want to) experience in their faith development.

Thirdly, being "in charge" of the worship service gives the young people an opportunity to look at what they do each Sunday as they participate in worship.

Fourthly, the youth service gives adult leadership in the church an opportunity to say to the youth, both directly and indirectly, that they are important, that we have confidence in them, and that they have something significant to offer to the body of Christ.

Abbreviated Vestry Minutes

Insurance report. Mr. Burn Curry has reviewed the canons and rules dealing with insurance coverage for employees of the church in the Diocese of Mississippi. He explained his findings to the group and answered questions. A motion was made to explore the alternatives for insurance coverage for our staff and clergy (Note: The Bishop has stated that clergy must remain with the church insurance corporation).

Outreach Commission. The report by Mrs. Beejee Dickson was discussed. Dr. Bob Brahan is the Vestry Liaison and requested that he be notified about their meetings.

Garth Report. Dr. Carmichael reported that Mrs. Lynn Gammill has had work done on the Garth. A company is trying to repair the fountain one more time. Dr. Carmichael asked Leighton Lewis Jr. to examine and repair all broken sprinkler heads. He estimates that the cost of this project will be between \$250 and \$300. The Garth will be cleaned and replanted when the sprinklers are repaired. Mrs. Gammill will see about the planting and will talk with a yard man who will keep up the Garth on a monthly basis. She is still working on the Columbarium and will report when they have a plan. The broken cross has been taken to an iron-works to see if it can be repaired.

The Bread Basket donation. Mrs. Pam Napier reported on the Community Bread

Basket and noted that we did not make a contribution in 2008. We formerly gave \$1000 per year. The vestry voted to begin now to donate \$100 per month to the Bread Basket ministry.

Emergency Fund. Fr. Strop reported that the Trinity Episcopal Church Emergency Relief Fund has been established. Those who wish to add to this fund can send checks to the church made out to this fund. Fr. Strop and Mr. McKenzie will work out the details of what emergencies will qualify to use this money. The vestry voted to place the entire Hutcheson Fund in the Emergency Relief Fund. (Note: The previous Vestry voted in 2007 to give the entire Hutcheson Fund to the Rector's Discretionary Fund.)

2008 Worship Guide for Hattiesburg American. Mrs. Dodds distributed information on the Worship Guide. The vestry voted to not pay for this ad this year.

2007 Parochial Report. Fr. Strop presented the Parochial Report that is past due to the Diocese. The numbers were announced as to members and attendance. Financial information is also included in the report. The vestry voted to approve the report.

Monthly Distribution of Pledge Income. Mrs. Jan Moore made a report on the monthly pledge income. The most

pledge money comes in the month of December. This makes it difficult to meet the monthly bills. The first three months of 2008 reflect more income than last year.

Financial Report. Mrs. Moore reported that we are still holding checks and are in need of more cash. There were many contributions from those who don't pledge. The Mary Martha's made donations. The vestry voted to accept the financial report.

Special Donation Announced. Dr. Carmichael reported that a friend of the parish wants to donate a gift of stock to the Parish.

The Trinity Episcopal Church Trust.
The finance commission reported that

they discovered a CD for approximately \$9,000 held in a Trust. The purpose of the trust was to provide missionary, charitable, and educational work in South Mississippi and other areas in the U.S. The only living trustee of the trust is Mr. B.W. Curry, Sr. Other Trustees are the Rector, Sr. Warden, and President of TECW, and other trustee would be a former Sr. Warden. After discussion, the Vestry voted unanimously to ratify the Trustees and to elect Burn Curry as a new Trustee. The Vestry is to give direction to the Trustees on how to spend the money. This will be done at the next meeting of the Vestry.

The meeting adjourned at 6:12 p.m. after closing prayers.

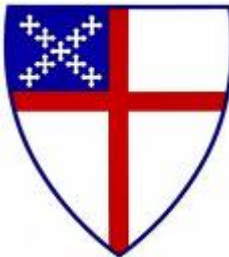

New Education for Ministry Group to Begin Fall 2008

One of the tasks I set out to accomplish was to establish a second Education for Ministry Group at Trinity – a group that would meet in the evenings. I am pleased to announce that the second group will convene this fall – provided that enough people sign up to participate. Ten seats are available for participants from Trinity; two seats have been taken by people from Ascension. Ms. Jane Lee, a certified EFM mentor, will facilitate this new group.

As described on the EFM web site, "EFM is a program of theological education-at-a-distance of the School of Theology of the University of the South. Students sign up one year at a time for this four-year program. It covers the basics of a theological education in the Old and New Testaments, church history, liturgy, and theology. Students meet regularly, usually once a week, in seminars under the guidance of trained mentors. The program grants a certifi-

cate at the completion of the four years and 18 Continuing Education Units for each year's work." I believe that EFM is about the best course of study in Bible, Theology, and Ministry outside of seminary. You can learn more about EFM at <http://www.sewanee.edu/EFM/index.htm>.

The EFM program runs the entire academic year (about 34 weeks). An EFM group can consist of first, second, third, and fourth year students all studying at the same time, so if you have taken a year or two of EFM at another place or time, but haven't finished your full four years, now is a good time to register.

Materials cost about \$340. If you are interested in this program, please contact the church office at 601-544-5551. We will need to register our students and order the materials soon, so please call us as soon as you can to register. Remember, only 10 seats are available.

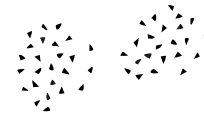

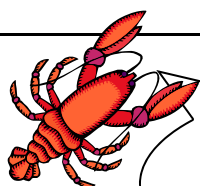
