We are about half way through this Lenten season, and Easter will be here before we know it. And there is a great temptation to try to “sleep walk” through Lent and only awaken on Easter morning to the sound of “Hail Thee Festival Day” and the smell of lilies. But there is great value in experiencing a Holy Lent. It is a time to examine our lives and find those areas where we might have distanced ourselves – knowingly or un-

cial. Easter does not just stay a commemorative holiday where we celebrate the empty tomb and the risen Lord, but it becomes a time when we celebrate our own reconnection with God at the end of our Lenten journey. We awaken not from a walk in our sleep, but we rise as new creations made possible by God's grace and the hard work of changing our ways and amending our lives to receive that grace. As the Spanish mystic John of the Cross wrote, "Whatever is received is received according to the mode of the receiver."

Easter is all about change. In Church we will see changes in the colors of the season, and we will witness the return of the customary silver and gold vessels on the altar. Altar flowers will return, and the Alleluias will resound once more. The solemnity of Lent where we remember by recitation of the Penitential Order our tendency to separate ourselves from God is set aside during the Easter season by the absence of the confession. We marvel at the miracle of the resurrection, and

the change in mind, body, and spirit that resurrection can and will bring to all of us. We are humbled by the astonishing gift God gave to us when he allowed us to experience God's presence in the person of Jesus as a teacher, preacher, rabbi, and friend, and as the resurrected Christ.

Easter will be here soon enough. For now, I hope that we will all continue our walk through Lent. I hope you are willing to challenge yourself a little and live into *this* season of the Church year even as we anxiously await the next.

Lord, enfold me in the depths of your heart; and there hold me, refine, purge, and set me on fire, raise me aloft, until my own self knows utter annihilation.

Teach Them to Fish Mission Trip Report



Dear fellow Trinitarians:

On behalf of Bishop Lloyd Allen, Rev. Roselia, the ladies of Omoa, Chris and myself, I want to thank you for the support that allowed us to begin our mission, "Teach Them to Fish."

Although frustrated with supply issues, we had a very productive mission from January 31 - February 3. With your donations, we were able to begin teaching with two soldering irons and reo-stats, two cutters, a glass grinder, six kaleidoscope kits, foil, aquairum gems and a miscellany of other supplies. We were even able to pay a local carpenter to build a seven-foot work table and three seven-foot benches. Not only will we have an adequate workspace, but the medical mission will be able to make use of the table and benches in a week or two. The rest of the donations went to airfare, rental car, food, exit taxes, and hotel.

We still, however, need your help. the mission here needs to get a friendly (as in free) CPA and lawyer to help set up and maintain the books, and non-profit corporation status. We also need

volunteers to go to Omoa, to build shelves, help repair the church, and paint. For those of you wondering if you will have to sleep under the stars, we will stay at a hotel called the Flamingo (which has an armed guard). While you won't be able to drink the water, or get places on a "western" time schedule, there is a beautiful beach and good seafood.

Come meet with us at our new time, Wednesdays at 5:30 p.m. in Classroom 6 of the Parish Hall. We will be making plans, breaking glass, and listening to the choir practice. If you have any questions, use any of the contacts below.

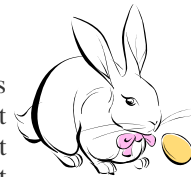

New Education for Ministry Group to Begin Fall 2008

One of the tasks I set out to accomplish was to establish a second Education for Ministry Group at Trinity – a group that would meet in the evenings. I am pleased to announce that the second group will convene this fall – provided that enough people sign up to participate. Ten seats are available for participants from Trinity; two seats have been taken by people from Ascension. Ms. Jane Lee, a certified EFM mentor, will facilitate this new group.

As described on the EFM web site, “EFM is a program of theological education-at-a-distance of the School of Theology of the University of the South. Students sign up one year at a time for this four-year program. It covers the basics of a theological education in the Old and New Testaments, church history, liturgy, and theology. Students meet regularly, usually once a week, in seminars under the guidance of trained mentors. The program grants a certifi-

cate at the completion of the four years and 18 Continuing Education Units for each year’s work.” I believe that EFM is about the best course of study in Bible, Theology, and Ministry outside of seminary. You can learn more about EFM at <http://www.sewane.edu/EFM/index.htm>.

The EFM program runs the entire academic year (about 34 weeks). An EFM group can consist of first, second, third, and fourth year students all studying at the same time, so if you have taken a year or two of EFM at another place or time, but haven’t finished your full four years, now is a good time to register.

Materials cost about \$340. If you are interested in this program, please contact the church office at 601-544-5551. We will need to register our students and order the materials soon, so please call us as soon as you can to register. Remember, only 10 seats are available.

Volunteers Needed for Interfaith Assistance Program

Interfaith Assistance is a telephone ministry of Trinity, Ascension, and University Baptist that provides financial assistance for emergency needs for people in Forrest Co. and the Oak Grove area of Lamar Co. Clients leave messages on an answering machine. Volunteers check the messages and return phone calls to discuss the clients requests. Services are provided Monday through Friday. Volunteers can check the messages from home or work, either several times a day or in the afternoon after work, returning the calls that

day. After discussing the request with the client the volunteer determines whether or not assistance can be given and completes simple paperwork to insure payment of pledges made. TRAINING IS PROVIDED and support is always available for the volunteer. Each volunteer commits one week or less in a three month period. Checking and returning calls usually takes less than two hours. For more information contact Babs Faulk at 601/268-0456.

Abbreviated Vestry Minutes

Approval of Mr. Lewis to act on behalf of vestry. Mr. Lewis volunteered to oversee the burning of the white house and oversee cleaning up the lot when the burn is over. The vestry voted to authorize Mr. Lewis to work on both projects.

Health Insurance. Fr. Stroop reported on his discussion with Kathryn Weathersby-McCormick about health insurance through the diocese. All clergy insurance is required by the diocese to go through their group. It is anticipated that all employees will be soon be required to hold insurance from this same company. Mr. Burn Curry noted that he feels that we should be able to secure other health insurance for our employees other than the Rector. It was suggested that we approach Mr. Bob Johnson about insurance for our employees. Mr. Curry will investigate what the canons say that we must do about purchasing insurance through the Diocese. All canons are on the web.

Financial Statement. Dr. Carmichael introduced Mrs. Jan Moore, Treasurer, to the new members of the Vestry. The loan from the Burkes account is on the balance sheet and it will be paid back. We finished the year with about \$9700 in the

bank. This statement is the one that was discussed at the Annual Meeting in January. Jan Moore distributed a draft expense account report for January. This document will explain the money crunch that we are currently experiencing. The vestry approved the financial report.

Commission Chairpersons. Dr. Carmichael requested that the members of the Vestry consider becoming commission chair persons. Leaders are needed for Stewardship and Parish Activities.

Fr. Stroop approved to teach. In August, 2007, Fr. Stroop requested to teach one course this spring at Southern Miss. This was brought up at the Mutual Ministry Review for the second time. The vestry voted to approve Fr. Bill's teaching one course per semester.

Angel Food. The Angel Food program is a food distribution network that allows persons to purchase a one month supply of food at a lower price. It operates through Christian Services in Hattiesburg.

The meeting adjourned at 6:30 p.m.
